



To highlight the essential place of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in the

To receive the Eucharist and to contemplate the Blessed Sacrament not only nourishes us and strengthens faith, but makes demands on how we should live and how we should see the world.

Pope Benedict XVI in Sacramentum Caritatis "The bread I give is my flesh, for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51). In these words, the Lord reveals the meaning of the gift of his life for all people. These words also reveal his deep compassion for every man and woman. The Gospels often tell of Jesus' feelings towards others, especially the suffering and sinners. Through a profoundly human sensibility he expresses God's saving will for all people - that they may have true life. Each celebration of the Eucharist makes sacramentally present the gift that the crucified Lord made of his life, for us and all the world. In the Eucharist, Jesus also makes us witnesses of God's compassion towards all our brothers and sisters. The eucharistic mystery thus gives rise to a service of charity towards neighbour, which consists in the very fact that, in God and with God, I love even the person whom I do not like or even know. This can only take place on the basis of an intimate encounter with God, an encounter which has become a communion of will, affecting even my feelings. Then I learn to look on this other person not simply with my eyes and my feelings, but from the perspective of Jesus Christ. In all those I meet, I recognize brothers or sisters for whom the Lord gave his life, loving them "to the end". (Jn 13:1) Our communities, when they celebrate the Eucharist, must become ever more conscious that the sacrifice of Christ is for all, and that the Eucharist compels all who believe in him to become "bread that is broken" for others, and to work for the building of a more just and fraternal world. Each of us is called, together with Jesus, to be the bread broken for the life of the world.

The relationship between the eucharist and social commitment must be explicit. The recognition of this leads to a determination to restore



respect for the dignity of all men and women, created in God's image and likeness. Because of the mystery we celebrate, we must denounce situations contrary to human dignity, as Christ shed his blood for all, and at the same time affirm the inestimable val -ue of each individual person.
